Because of your unceasing support and God's provision, 2023 exhibited a uniquely blessed achievement for Life Center Ethiopia. Thank you so much. I also extend my special thanks to Life Center Ethiopia's Board of Directors in the USA and Ethiopia for their leadership, commitment, and comprehensive support to me personally.

Life Center raised \$241,033 in 2023. I am grateful to you, our dear friends, who faithfully supported Life Center with your unrelenting generosity. Thank you for trusting and standing with us to serve God in helping the orphans and the widows. In 2023, 146 people donated to Life Center Ethiopia, and 62 of them were new donors—Parise to our Lord Jesus Christ.

Because of your support, poor mothers own small businesses and are able to feed their children. You helped them become victorious over the poverty crunch. The women whose lives were degraded in prostitution rejected it and are emerging as ambitious entrepreneurs. They have decided to work hard and change their lives. This is heartwarming news for everyone who loves the Lord and believes in human dignity. In 2023 alone, we granted 192 new loans to widows and vulnerable women, provided them prayers, counseling, coaching, and training, and distributed hundreds of bibles to our community.

2023 was the year of graduation for many of our children from childhood to teenage years, from elementary and middle schools to high schools and colleges. Because of your support, they have embarked on a new journey of adulthood full of hope, energy, and enthusiasm. Some have become business owners,

while others have started a high-level entrepreneurial training program to become community influencers through business. They look forward to multiplying the vision of Life Center across the country. Hundreds of orphan children have also joined the Life Center family, experiencing renewed hope, while many thousands are in line seeking the same opportunity.

Being aware of your backup, Life Center staff work with exceptional commitment. They give unconditional love to the children and women we serve and have built trust that they are comfortable sharing their struggles. We have established a family of love, a community of hope.

God is using you, our supporters and partners, to change the lives of individuals and communities in Ethiopia through Life Center. I am excited to see Life Center expand to new areas of the country in 2024 and become the shelter of love, transformation, and self-esteem for thousands of orphans and widows, who, in turn, will change their communities' lives.

In 2023, Life Center is promoted to the Ethiopian people in a big way via Ethiopian newspapers, magazines, and radio and television programs. This is the first of its kind and scope. This opens new opportunities for Life Center to continue developing a network and openly supporting our projects in Ethiopia.

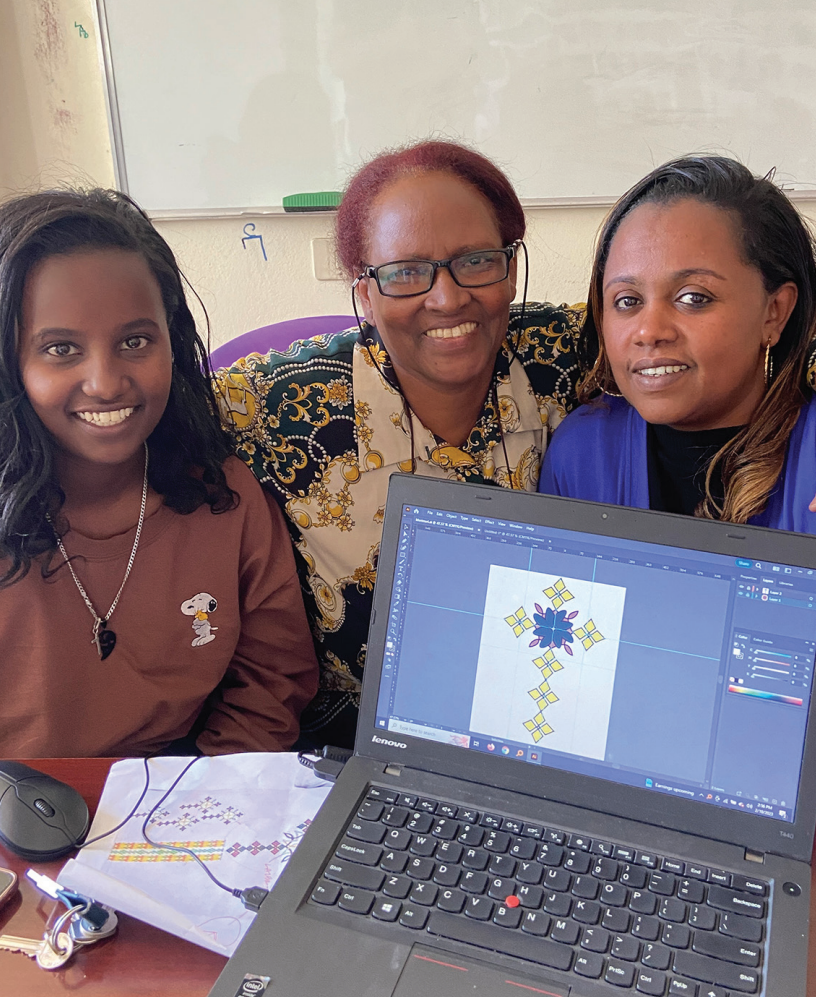

Through your heartfelt donations, you are building skills that transform lives.



Sponsorship delivers expedient growth for children Academically, Personally, Socially, and Holistically.

What \$40 per month does for a family:

- As of December 31, 2023, 276 children were sponsored. 218 of them are in Addis, and 58 are in Sekota.
- After-school tutoring is provided to 75 students, grades 5-8, three times a week. At each tutorial session, they also receive snacks. Computer training and tutoring are provided to students 9-12.
- Parents and caregivers attend free parenting training classes to learn how to raise their children.
- \$4,392 was spent on providing food during tutoring sessions in 2023.

Our widow microloan program is much more when you see the impactful results.

As of 12/31/2023

- 192 Loans Distributed
- 294 Loans Total: 252 in Addis Ababa, 42 in Meki
- 87 Loans are Completely Paid
- 10 Basic Business Course training for 300 Women. They included the initial training, business plan coaching, and business setup. After establishing a business, the women receive monthly follow-up calls or visits to help and encourage the new business owners! *in partnership with Touch Of Love International (TOLI)



Life Center Ethiopia's women's microloan program, offered in partnership with Touch of Love International (TOLI), has rapidly grown. Due to the high level of growth and demand, the Course was delivered monthly to loan beneficiaries. The course provides women with the skills needed to run a business successfully.



My name is Fetia Delil.

I am a wife and a mother of four children. After I gave birth to my fourth child, my husband left us, and I had to provide for my children alone. After two years, my husband came back when his health began failing him, so I had to take care of five people in addition to myself. It was challenging until I came to Life Center and received a microloan and sponsorship for my oldest daughter. My daughter is 21 and helps me run my merchandise business to provide for our family.

I went to Life Center to get business training for my poultry business; in addition to training, I also became a microloan beneficiary. I am now optimistic I can grow my business and become successful with the help of God and Life Center.



Thanks to you, our donors, our Special Projects were one of the major highlights of the year!

In 2023, we launched two new Special Projects with the generous support of our donors.



T-Shirt Printing Business:

10 teenage orphans have been selected to run a t-shirt printing business. They have all finished school and have received the necessary business training to be successful. They are eager and excited to help the Ethiopian economy. The fundraised money will be used to purchase a heat press, printer, and a high-quality computer for graphic design..



Sewing Department Expansion:

At the end of 2023, we purchased seven more sewing machines to double our capacity. Now, 12 women can sew at once, and more can be trained in sewing skills to one day start a business.



My name is Firehiwot Sileshi.

I was born and raised in the Oromia region of Ethiopia. I am a widow and have a daughter. We were forced to leave home on June 30, 2020, due to civil unrest, so we currently live in Addis Ababa with 7 of my relatives and two children in a 2-bedroom house. I work as a hotel security guard to provide for my daughter. I heard about Life Center Ethiopia through our local government partners and joined their sewing program. Designing was once a dream of mine, and the Life Center staff made that dream possible.

In 2023, Ethiopia faced a famine, and the civil unrest caused many people to go without food. In response, Life Center Ethiopia partnered with Maximum Impact Foundation to provide food to starving people in Sekota.



Garden and Well Project



In Sekota, 10 widows work in the garden to earn an income for their families as well as provide fresh vegetables for the surrounding community.

Additionally, Life Center installed multiple clean water wells that provide drinking water to the community and irrigation to the garden.

As a single parent, she faced immense challenges trying to provide for me after the loss of my father and sister. However, it was at Life Center that our story took a beautiful turn. Surrounded by caring mentors and a supportive community, I found solace and inspiration. Life Center became more than just a place for education; it was a sanctuary where hope was restored and dreams were nurtured. 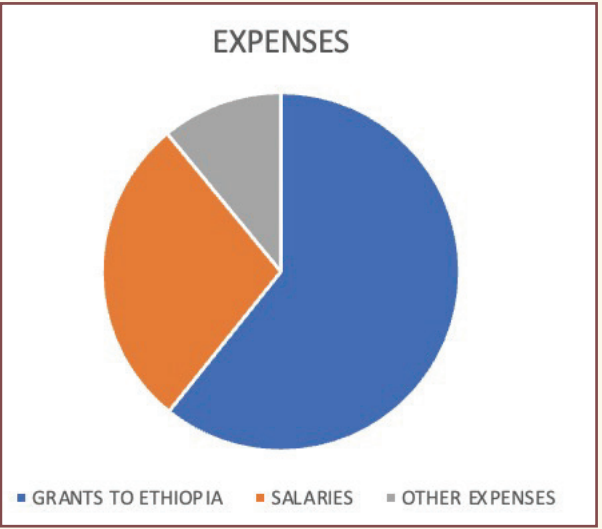

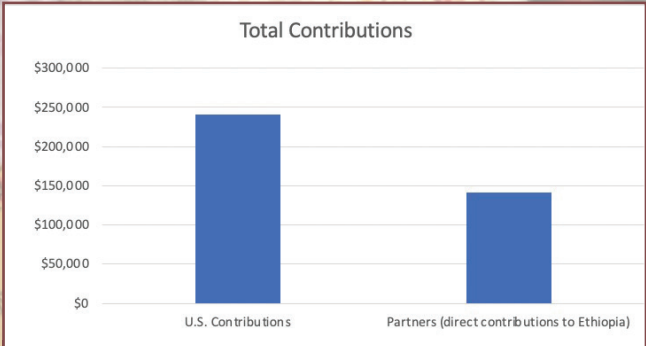
